"Pointing to his disciples, Jesus said 'Here are my mother and brothers. For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother." Matthew 12:49

In the story referenced above, Jesus had just exercised a demon-possessed man who was blind and mute. When the Pharisees heard about it, they accused Jesus of being demon possessed himself. Tensions were clearly rising and Jesus' family was starting to get concerned. So Jesus' mother and younger brothers came to reel him back in.

His mother exclaimed, "Jesus, would you just come home and tone it down a bit? You're starting to make some enemies of these religious folk and it's getting us a little nervous." [My paraphrasing to the above conversation that ensued.]

That's when Jesus asked the question of the crowd he was teaching, "Who is my mother and who are my brothers?" It was a difficult question to hear, not because Jesus was being disrespectful to his family, but because he was challenging the notion of what it means to be part of God's family. Do we gain entrance into God's family by birth? Or is there something else going on? Something spiritual?

Let us remember that whenever Jesus asks a question, it is never because he doesn't know the answer to it. He asks the question to see if we know the answer to his questions. Jesus asked this question to get his disciples and us to really consider what it means to be part of God's family of faith.

One of my favorite moments during the sacrament of baptism is walking the baby, child, youth, or adult through the congregation and introducing them to their new spiritual family. There are spiritual moms and dads, grandparents, siblings, and even aunts and uncles. People that we become connected to not through human will but upon faith in Christ as we are adopted as children and heirs into God's family. This was a significant shift in Jesus' day for people to wrap their brains around just as it is for us today.

At Cascades Presbyterian Church we are blessed to be part of a such a wonderful church family. Over my nineteen years of serving as pastor, there have been some incredible people with whom I have been incredibly close.

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR MEMBERS

Portland-born, the youngest of four girls, her father an insurance adjuster for The Hartford, her mother an administrative executive secretary with Portland Public Schools, she spent two toddler years in Bellevue, WA, but the rest of her youth on Portland's Alameda Street, riding her bike to Blue Lake Park, climbing up Rocky Butte, and taking the bus to Lloyd Center. Born in Edmonton, Alberta, he nevertheless lived his first four years in Germany and Austria, one of four children of his missionary parents who in 1956 settled in Portland, with two memorable years later in the wilds of Canada.



She attended Gregory Heights Elementary School and Madison High School, then earned degrees or post-baccalaureate certificates from Washington State (Pullman), Portland Community College, Concordia University, and Heritage University in Toppenish, WA. He graduated from David Douglas High School in Portland and attended community college.

Sandy Cox worked in health records information, as an administrative assistant, a library clerk, a director of Christian education for the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod, and an elementary school teacher. Her favorite job was as "facilitator for her family." In other words, she spent 20 wonderful years as a stay-at-home mom to her children. Dave Freisen found his life's work in the audio industry. He spent 15 years in retail, then became a manufacturer's representative and still enjoys his profession. Living in the Seattle area, he decided to try a dating website. Sandy enjoys sudoku, crosswords, Scrabble, cribbage, playing piano, and together both enjoy backgammon. Dave enjoys collecting vintage audio gear and enjoys his orange kitty who hates everyone but him!

Dave has two daughters living locally (in Camas and Portland) and one in Fort Worth, TX. Sandy's children are Elizabeth, twins Margaret and Caroline, and John Isaac. Her seven grandkids range in age from first grade to college freshman, three in Alaska and four in the Vancouver area.

Sandy says, "In my family we have a saying that is kind of our motto, so much so that I cross-stitched it years ago and it hangs in my room: "LIFE is pretty darn good!" COMMUNION PROCESSES

As normal church life returns after the pandemic, one of the things we are still working on is our communion protocol. There are two ways to receive communion on the first Sunday of each month. One way is by forming two lines down the center isles for those who would prefer making the "journey" forward toward the chancel. The second way is by remaining seated while servers bring the elements to you. We have found that the gluten-free bread is a little too crumbly when torn off the loaf and given to communicants. Because of this, we will try serving cut cubes of bread served on pattens (silver plates) instead. While we may resort to using tongs for serving, it does make it more complicated for servers. That being said, be assured that servers always use hand sanitizer right before serving to reduce the spread of germs. Thanks for your patient understanding.

APRIL SESSION NOTES

Elder Christie Mistrot led devotions on Matthew 11:28-30 and discussed the difference between working with Jesus verses working for Jesus. Approved to receive new members by letters of transfer. Granted Sarah Shewbert a monthlong sabbatical over summer to enjoy time off with family. Approved \$2500 grant to Family Promise of Clark County from Benevolence Board. Moved to approve baptism for Raynee Morgan Wallschlaeger on April 21, 2024 during worship. Provided feedback on New Members Retreat. Identified more potential new members for Fall Retreat. Elders shared their Spiritual Gifts from assessment. Reviewed Strategic Plan from 2023 and celebrated accomplishments, identified items that need attention, and let go of those things that have fallen off our radar. Projectors in sanctuary will need replaced soon. Overall, great sense of energy with 13 new members. So much easier to work with Jesus than for him.

STRATEGIC PLANNING UPDATE

In January 2023, thirty one people from Cascades got together for a day of Long Range Strategic Planning. This community based plan incorporated future ideals, current realities, and a five year strategic ministry plan. Session celebrates the following accomplishments in 2023/2024: painting church exterior, setting up compost bins, increased stewardship giving, securing new church partnerships to replace Love of God Church rent, developing men's ministry with monthly bible study gatherings and offering a men's retreat, revamping the prayer partner ministry, increasing VBS participation by 15%, planning a Honduras Mission Trip including Cascades' youth, developing a new drummer for worship team, and increasing membership by 13% (5% was our goal!). We let go of the following dreams (for now): Church trip to Israel/Holy Land. We are looking forward continuing our work towards: restarting the kitchen remodeling project, developing plans for an onsite community garden, creating job description for a possible second pastoral staff position, reengaging Silver Star and Sunset Elementary Schools in mission, exploring intergenerational Life Groups, planning two fun summertime events, and revamping our dinners for eight/Top of the Hill potluck model.


